

Sydney, Australia, 09 November 2022: Good Neighbours Australia aims to share the joy of giving with children affected by flood in Quang Binh, Vietnam through its Christmas Crafternoon fundraising event on 03 December 2022 at Corydon Park.

Just like any child, Vang Nguyet Nga, 7 years old, dreamt of receiving a gift on Christmas. "Christmas is the day Santa goes to give presents, but I have not received them yet," Vang said.

Christmas Crafternoon will be benefiting kids like Vang from Quang Binh, a rural district in Vietnam, that experienced extreme flooding and landslides in September 2022. The flood injured several individuals, damaged 155 houses, and lost more than 1,000 hectares of agricultural land, wiping out the source of local food and incomes. Until today, there is an ongoing need for reconstruction of collapsed houses, food, medicines and other necessary items.
