

What is the learning pit?

At our last assembly, I asked students to research "The Learning Pit." Learning is not always easy, but through determination, collaboration, support and questioning we attain our personal best. At PPS, we strive to work shoulder-to-shoulder with students as they achieve their goals. In each lesson, we use the model "I can do this", "We can do this". "You can do this" also known as modelled, guided and independent learning. It's a life long skill that sets children up to be reflective learners.



What are the school houses?

Much like Hogwarts, on enrolment, children are divided into one of four sporting houses: Banksia (Green), Kurrajong (Blue), Waratah (Red) and Wattle (Yellow). At sporting events, children wear their house colour and build teamwork skills. Smart watches and other mobile devices

Last week, an email was sent to all families in Stage 3 regarding the use of smart watches and other mobile devices during school hours. A copy of this email is included below as we now realise students younger than Year 5 also have phones and smart watches at school. Each classroom has now been supplied with a secure box to store devices upon entry to the classroom. Children then receive these devices at the end of each day. Please read the email below:



Dear parents and carers,

We are seeking your support to talk with your child/children about the appropriate use of smart watches and other mobile devices at school. We have recently become aware that children are messaging families from their smart watch or device during school time. Stage 3 teachers will be running a refresher session today, regarding the appropriate use of technology at school. All Stage 3 children have been given a copy of our mobile and electronic devices policy, which can be found (hopefully) in their school bag. Like phones, smart watches must be handed in at the office each day or remain in bags if they are brought to school. We are classifying smart watches as those watches that can receive messages, make phone calls, take photos and/or play games. These items are disruptive in lessons and can get easily lost. We understand that parents may need to contact their child during the school day. If this is the case, please contact the school office (9560 9665) and a message will be promptly taken to your child in their classroom. We note that mobile devices can be useful methods for essential before or after school communication. Therefore, whilst Petersham PS discourages students from bringing devices to school, it is the responsibility of the student to abide by the appropriate use guidelines as outlined in the policy. https://petersham-p/localcontent/Mobile and Electronic Devices Policy PPS 2022.pdf



Come teach ethics at Petersham Public School

We deliver an ethics program at Petersham Public School with lessons delivered by Primary Ethics volunteers.

Ethics lessons are now offered to students in years 1 to 6. In ethics, students explore everyday issues suitable for their age. They learn to listen closely to each other, to disagree without putdowns and to think carefully as they form their opinions.

We have children on waitlists for Kindy and years 1, 2, 3 & 4.We want to give all parents the option to choose ethics for their children. Currently some children who have enjoyed learning Ethics last year, will be put onto waitlists until we have more teachers available.

You can teach ethics if:

- You're interested in what children think and you have an interest in learning
- · You're willing to learn how to use our lesson scripts to ask children ethical questions
- You can remain neutral and give the children space to think
- You're available each school week at Fridays from 10.45-11.15am you'll need about an hour each week to prepare and give the scripted lesson
- You complete our free training and pass background checks.

You will join a great community of Primary Ethics volunteers – at Petersham Public School and across NSW. You'll have the rewarding opportunity of listening to the fantastic students at our school and helping them grow. You'll develop new skills yourself – facilitation skills, plus skills in communication and active listening.




